Item	Discussion
Welcome & Introductions	Began meeting at 2:50 PM. Those in attendance had introduced themselves at the regular HCSC meeting with the addition of Andy Murphy from Cal Fire/TC Fire and Steve Boyack from Human Services Agency.
Workgroup Focus- Objectives	Discussed the formation of the group as a means to enhance communication, coordination, and implementation of evacuation and mass care/sheltering plans and activities in the county. Participants hope to share lessons learned and best practices from previous events, identify roles and responsibilities and coordinate efforts.
Topics and Issues for Future Meetings	The following issues and topics were suggested as content for discussion at upcoming meetings: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Detailed roles and responsibilities• Mass care-shelter site lists and criteria for identification and selection• PG&E emergency safety shutoff program, how it affects residents and potential shelter sites• Communications and notifications (between agencies and partners, and to the public)• Review of HSA Mass Care & Shelter plan• Healthcare & Safety Coalition partners acting as a Multi-Agency Coordination system (MAC) to reach at-risk populations (meeting and coordinating at a separate location from the ICP)• Access and Functional Needs considerations (possibly provide training again that was offered via OES some years ago?)• Functional Assessment Service Teams (FAST) (State DSS can provide training to develop a local team)• Security at shelter sites• ICS structure (how mass care and emergency assistance fits, etc.)• Family reunification• Training and exercise opportunities (county employees as Disaster Service Workers, etc.)• The MAC coordinating with law enforcement/first responders to reach all residents re: evacuation• Animals and pets• Review of AB1152, effective January 2019• Coordination of existing evacuation, mass care-sheltering, emergency assistance plans Continued...

- Activation triggers (The who, how, why, when)
- Citizen personal preparedness (outreach, education, etc.)
- Spontaneous and non-traditional shelters
